Athlete

Ruben Dominguez Jr. is a native of El Paso and now resides in Arlington, Texas. He attended Austin High School and graduated in 1974. He participated in cross country ('72-'73) and in track ('71-'74) during his years at Austin High School.

He was the 1973 Class 4A Cross Country State Champion. His fastest times in a 2-mile cross country competition was 9:18 and in a 3-mile cross country competition was 15:08. He is listed in the UIL Top Ten All-Time Cross Country State Finishers.

He was also the 1974 Class 4A Mile Run State Champion. His fastest time in the mile was a 4:17 at the state track meet. He has the 9th fastest time ever in the 1600 meter (converted from my best mile time) for an El Paso high school long distance runner. In his junior year, he was on the 1973 Distance Medley Relay (440, 880, 1320, mile) that posted the 29th fastest time in the nation.

He attended UTEP on an athletic scholarship for cross country and track. He was an alternate team member on the 1975 NCAA Cross Country

National Championship team. He graduated from UTEP in 1979 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Electrical Engineering. His academic achievements earned induction into the Eta Kappa Nu and Tau Beta Pi Engineering Honor Societies. In his career as an engineer, he has been granted 2 U.S. Patents. He works as a Quality Engineer at Lockheed Martin located in Grand Prairie, Texas. He volunteers at the North Texas Food Bank and mentors high school cross country and track runners.



Paul Pearson

Athlete

Paul Pearson has been competing in track meets for 50 years. He grew up in Ontario, Canada where he won the Provincial 880 yard Championship his senior year of high school, won numerous Canadian Junior (under 20) Championships, and set a National Junior Record at 1500 meters. He placed 2nd in the 1500m and 3rd in the 800m at the 1972 Canadian Olympic Trials

In 1972 he joined the UTEP Miners. During his two year career at UTEP, he was a member of teams that finished 2nd at NCAA Indoor Track, 2nd at NCAA Cross Country,

and won the NCAA Indoor Track Championship. Paul ran on the Distance Medley Relay team that finished 3rd at the NCAA Indoor Championships garnering him All American honors. In 2003, Paul was inducted into the UTEP Athletic Hall of Fame as a member of this team

Following graduation, Paul competed for Canada at the Pan American Games and the World Cross Country Championships. Paul coached track and cross country in the local school districts where his teams won numerous district and regional titles, and state

medals. His athletes are now head coaches at many of the local high schools.

In 2006, Paul returned to the track as a Master (over 40) athlete. He has set many El Paso Senior Games records, won multiple Texas Senior Games titles, won the National Senior Games, the USATF Championships, multiple USATF National Championships medals, and top ten finishes at the World Masters Championships. He continues to compete at the national level.



Edmund Stansbury

Athlete

Ed Stansbury was born May 3, 1979 to Ed and Seta Stansbury. They made El Paso their home in 1982, where he grew up with his brothers, Hal (UTEP) and Don (SMU).

As a 14-year-old Irvin freshman, Ed was named starting varsity quarterback for the playoff game at Sun Bowl Stadium against Riverside. That game and a 200-plus yard passing performance would define his path and thrust him and El Paso into the national spotlight. He was a four year starter for coach Tony Shaw and won four district championships. He was ranked the #3 quarterback nationally and #1 in the Big 12 region. He was a consensus

All-American and the 13th offensive prospect nationally after completing 359 of 769 passes for 5,596 yards and 49 touchdowns. Ed was a 5-star blue chip recruit and had offers from nearly every Division I school in the country. As a sophomore, Ed won the discus state championship with a throw of 189'2".

As a senior, he recorded the 2nd longest throw in Texas state history and 14th nationally with a distance of 206 ft. He would also go on to recapture gold in the state discus throw obtaining a #2 national ranking and All-American recognition.

At UCLA, Stansbury won two Pac-10 championships in football under coach Bob Toledo and was

on the 1998 Pac 10 champion track and field team. He received individual Pac 10 honors as a fullback and was considered one of the top fullbacks going into the 2002 NFL draft.

Ed went on to sign with the Houston Texans and was a member of the inaugural team that beat the Dallas Cowboys 19-10 in Reliant Stadium. In 2004, the Texans allocated him to NFL Europe where he was on the Berlin Thunder World Bowl Championship team.

Ed resides in Coto de Caza, California with his wife, Karis. They have two sons, West and Shaw. Ed is the Managing Member for Midtown Capital.



Jerry Pippins

Coach

The tennis coaching achievements of Jerry Pippins are staggering. The Coronado High School tennis coach has led the T-Birds to seven Final Four appearances highlighted by the 2000 state team tennis championship and three 2nd place finishes. Pippins coached two girls and one boys doubles teams to state titles. Coronado has won 16 straight district tennis team titles under Pippins and has never lost a team match to an El Paso high school. As a USTA administrator, Pippins has run adult tennis teams for more than 20-years in El Paso. More than 50 adult teams,

including five with Pippins playing, have qualified for tennis nationals. Pippins is the 2009 USTA Southwest Coach of the Year and 2013 inductee into the Southwest Greater El Paso Tennis Association Hall of Fame. A college football receiver, Pippins was on the 1973 Louisiana Tech Division II national championship football team. He moved to El Paso in 1979 and served for 12-years as a high school football assistant coach helping lead Jefferson to the 1-5A playoffs for the first time in its 40-year history. UTEP Miner basketball coach Tim Floyd

was friends with Jerry in college and wrote a recommendation letter noting, "It is incredible the amount of success he has had." Jerry and wife Deborah have two children, Deana and Kyle.



Mike Price

Coach

One winning season since 1988 and only 6 wins during the previous 3 years. That was the state of UTEP football when Mike Price was hired to resurrect the program. Coach Price had the reputation of a program builder at Weber State and Washington State where he was named the 1997 Sporting News National Coach of the Year.

The hiring of Mike Price brought instant dividends. UTEP had managed to hire a man that had coached at the highest levels of college football including two appearances in the Rose Bowl. ESPN and the national media covered the

press conference that introduced him to El Paso. Even better, the 2004 season saw the Miners soar to an 8-4 record, a top 25 ranking (23rd a first for the program), and an invitation to the Houston EV1 Bowl. 2005 saw another 8-4 record and a second straight bowl invitation. Mike Price lived up to his reputation with high powered offenses led by quarterbacks Jordan Palmer and Trevor Vittatoe. Crowds of 40,000+ and nationally televised games returned to the Sun Bowl. Fans were treated to games against national powers like Texas and Oklahoma. Big time college

football had come to El Paso and fans could be proud to say that they were Miners.

Mike Price retired in 2012 as the second winningest coach in program history and only the second coach to take the Miners to three bowl games. Coach Price and his wife, Joyce, still call El Paso home. He has and continues to promote the city at every opportunity. Most recently, he was named the 2014 Legend of the Sun Bowl. Tonight we honor Mike Price for all his contributions by inducting him into the El Paso Sports Athletic Hall of Fame.



Bob Geske

Official

After traveling around the globe with an Army family, and graduating from Houston Milby High School in 1964, Bob matriculated to Texas Western College that fall. He played freshman basketball under Moe Iba and Don Haskins, and in the spring of 1965 played baseball under Andy Cohen. He graduated in the fall of 1970 and became the director of Intramurals and Recreation at UTEP. He was teaching his officials how to officiate when Ben Collins told him to use that knowledge, join the football association and make a few extra dollars. Thus

began an avocation that spanned more than forty years. Football led to basketball which led to volleyball.

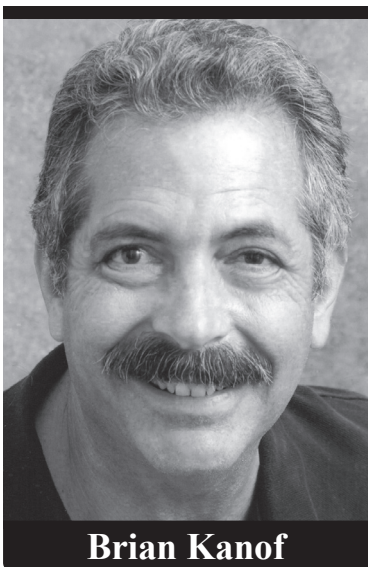
His football and basketball tenure spanned the years 1971 - 2007 and included local high school games and playoff contests throughout Texas coupled with college games at Western New Mexico University and Sul Ross State. Basketball also included UTEP and NMSU for women.

Volleyball also began in 1971 but ended in 2013. At one time he was working in five different college conferences, the professional International

Volleyball League {IVA}, and high school all over Texas and the Western U.S.

Of all his accomplishments, the one of which he is most proud is being selected by high school coaches, in three different sports, to work playoff games for twenty-four consecutive years.

Bob and Jeannie are both retired EPISD teachers and have three wonderful children, John, Teresa, Jeremy and five grandchildren. He is also the official scorekeeper for the Miner Basketball team.



Brian Kanof

Media

Brian Kanof was born in Portsmouth, VA to Elsie and Irving Kanof, 18 May 1949. He arrived in El Paso with his family in 1957.

He moved to Italy in 1964 with his parents and graduated from the Overseas School of Rome in 1967. He enrolled as a UTEP Journalism student that year and soon met Eddie Mullins; beginning a 40-year plus stint as the Athletic Department's photographer. He photographed UTEP's defeat of Old Miss 21-14 in the Sun Bowl his freshman year. He has photographed every Sun Bowl Game since. He received a BA in

Journalism in 1971 and an MA in the same discipline from Ball State University in 1972. Kanof was hired by The El Paso Times in 1969, named Chief Photographer in 1970 and left for graduate school in 1971.

Kanof was commissioned as an Army Officer through ROTC and spent his two years active duty as a Ft. Hood PAO. He finished his Army career in the reserves back in El Paso; his final seven years as a Green Beret. He retired as a Major.

Kanof taught Advertising, Public Relations, Video, Photography as well as Photojournalism at UTEP, Ball State,

Park University and EPCC.

While in Indiana, he worked for UPI and the Indianapolis News. Kanof returned to El Paso in 1974 to continue his freelance career. In 1978, he accepted a full-time position with Mithoff Advertising as photographer and Public Relations AE. In 1985, he established Brian Kanof Photography.

His Studio/Office is at 830 East Yandell where he specializes in Aerial, Commercial, Architectural and photo documentation, as well as his old mainstay, Photojournalism.
