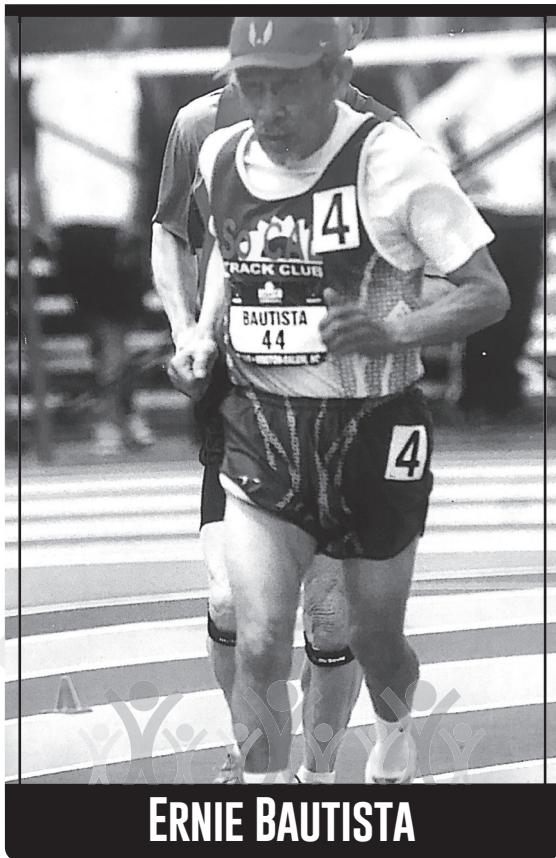

ERNIE BAUTISTA

ATHLETE

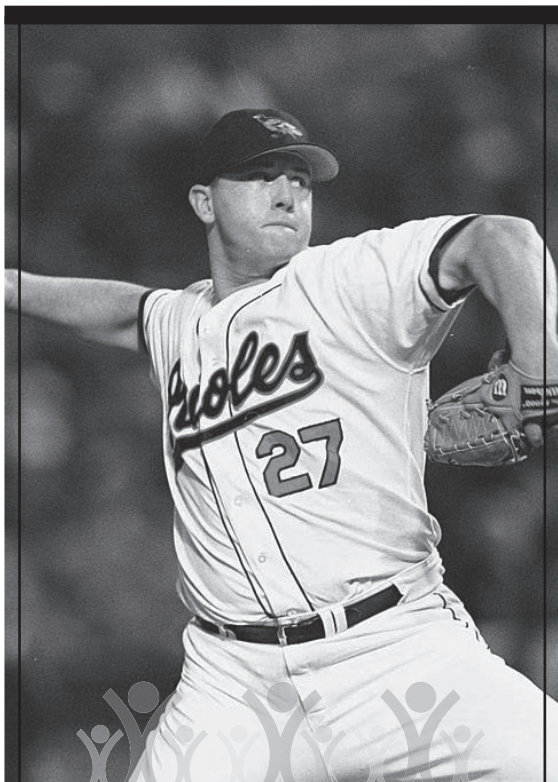
Ernie “Flaco” Bautista is 78 years young, and an El Paso born native. After graduating from high school, Ernie joined the United State Air Force where he served for four years. He continued his career as a civil servant for 43 years for the Department of the Army at Fort Bliss, Texas. Of those 43 years he was a fire fighter, fire inspector and safety technician. He retired in December of 2011.

Ernie is a self-taught runner, beginning in 1975. His long running career has allowed him to travel around the world. He has run in more than 600 5K, 8K and 10K races. He has also run more than 40 full marathons some which include the Boston Marathon, New York Marathon, Los Angeles Marathon, Duke City Marathon and the Mexico City Marathon.

Ernie’s track and field accomplishments have blossomed to a national

and world ranking level. He is ranked 4th in the United States and 11th in the world. He has participated in many senior games in different cities and states winning multiple gold medals, a silver medal and a bronze medal. In 2015 he was ranked 12th in the United States and 12th worldwide for the USATF indoor track and field championships. He received the “Phidippides Gold Award”, a coveted USATF achievement award for placing 1st in 16 races consecutively. In 2018 he received the Nolan Richardson “Champ of the Year” award.

Ernie still enjoys running and walking daily. He was planning on running several races throughout the United States this past year, but they were postponed due to the Covid-19 pandemic. He sees no signs of stopping and will continue to run races as long as he can.



JOHN "ROCKY" COPPINGER

ATHLETE

Only family and close friends know him as "John Thomas." Rocky's playing days and the way he played the game cast a major presence on the local scene. He was known as a fierce competitor blessed with the tools to dominate the game with both his bat and arm. He earned all-district, and all city honors all three years that he played varsity baseball at Coronado High School. Rocky is one of the rare stars that elevated the play of his teammates and helped take Coronado to baseball heights never experienced. Three district championships, two bi-district championships, two elite eight appearances, two national top rankings, and a 1992 Texas High School Final Four appearance. His batting average went from .487 to .536 with 13 home runs his sophomore year to .585 and 15 home runs his senior year. As you would expect his pitching numbers improved every year as well with a 2.05 ERA his sophomore year to 1.25 his senior year with an incredible 0.85 earned run average: finishing with a 25-5 record in his high school career.

When he is asked what his greatest personal memory in high school was without hesita-

tion Rocky cites his homerun at Cohen Stadium in high school that sent the T-Birds to the 1992 Texas High School Final Four.

Rocky signed a letter of intent with the University of Nebraska but opted to play at Hill College, Rocky pitched Hill College to a conference championship earning All American honors hitting .465 and leading the nation with 63 RBI's and 103 strike outs as a pitcher. After signing with the Baltimore Orioles, Coppinger was recognized as the #1 prospect in the organization. In 1996, he made the "show" just 4 years removed from high school, pitching for the playoff bound Orioles with a 10-6 record and finishing 3rd in the "Rookie of the Year" voting. His professional career included stops with the Orioles, Milwaukee Brewers and Oakland A's before injuries ended his playing journey.

Coppinger's baseball career continues as he promotes the game coaching the 11U B-17 Legends and being a "Girl Dad" now transitioning into coaching softball 25 years later. When baseball people talk about Rocky, everyone knows his last name is Coppinger-legendary probably, memorable definitely.



MONICA TOWNSEND

ATHLETE

Monica is a native El Pasoan who started playing golf 43 years ago with the influence of her father. He was the one who instilled the love of golf in her. At a young age she qualified 5 times for the Junior World Golf Championship. She attended Bel Air High School where she was a member of the golf team for 3 years. During those years she won district titles and qualified 3 times for regionals in Lubbock. She also played basketball while at Bel Air and was named to the all-city team her senior year.

In 1983 Monica received a full ride golf scholarship to New Mexico State University. She was a member of the 1985-1986 WAC Championship team which was inducted into the New Mexico State University Hall of Fame in 2005. She was also named the El Paso Golf Hall of Fame player of the year in 1983 and 1986. Monica won the Women's City golf championship in 1986, 1987 and 1988 and again in 2018 and 2019. She also won the Lone Star Women's Club championship in 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016 and 2018 and the President's Cup in 2019. Monica is hoping

to win another city championship this year.

As Monica has embarked into middle age or as they call it "Senior Citizen", she has completed and qualified for 2 USGA senior women's amateur championships making match play in one of them. She plans to continue competing at the highest level possible while still maintaining her responsibilities as a wife, mother, daughter, sister and grandmother.

Her success in golf does not come without the solid and loving support of her family. Her number one fan and coach is her husband Carl Townsend who is well-known in the golfing world. They have two sons; Ryan 27 and Matthew 24 and a granddaughter who is 3 named Ryan Emrie. Her father, Frank Campos who is no longer with the family but always in their hearts, taught Monica how to play the game of golf and to appreciate it. Her mother, Gloria is the rock of the family. She is no doubt the strongest women Monica knows. Her mother has shown her brothers, sister and herself how important family is and for that she is forever grateful.



TONY GRIJALVA

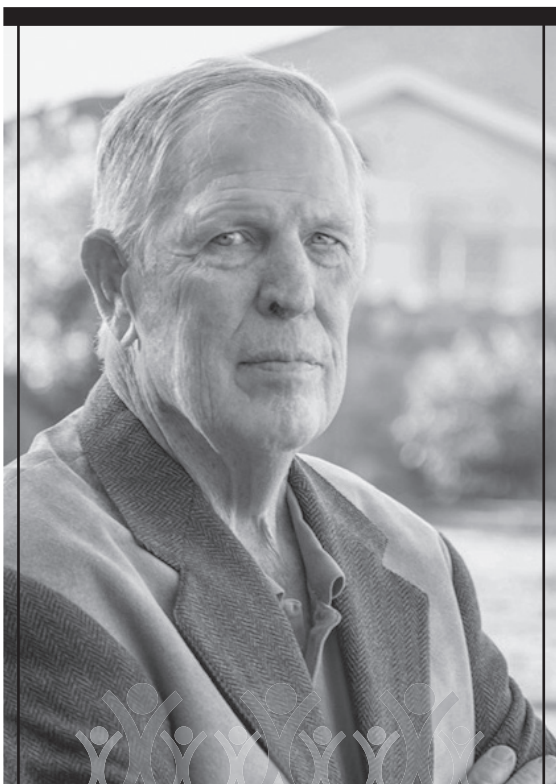
COACH

Tony Grijalva graduated from Austin High School in 1970 and from the University of Texas El Paso in 1975 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Education. After graduation, he began his teaching career at Alamo and Putnam Elementary schools before moving to Lincoln Junior High School in 1980. While at Lincoln he taught as well as coached basketball and football where he was the head 9th grade football coach. His team went 32-2 with four district championships in four years. In 1993, Coach Grijalva transferred to Franklin High School to coach alongside Coach Milton Henry. In 1999, Coach Henry offered Coach Grijalva the defensive coordinator position at which time the “Black Swarm” shutout began. Under Coach Grijalva his team shutout all district opponents by a combined score of 214-0.

In 2000, Coach Henry retired, and Coach Grijalva took over the football program as the new head coach of the Franklin Cougars. In the seven years under Coach Grijalva, the cougars had two undefeated

seasons and won or shared five district titles. Franklin also won four bi-district titles, 1 area championship and 1 regional championship during that time. Coach Grijalva was one of the first coaches to expand the use of the spread offense in which Franklin had success defeating out-of-town powerhouse teams such as Las Cruces High, Roswell High, Midland Lee, Lubbock Monterey, Lubbock Coronado, San Angelo Central and Mansfield Summit. In 2005, Franklin was the first El Paso area team to defeat two out-of-town opponents during the Texas high school playoffs in the same season. Franklin went on to play in the Elite 8 against Eules Trinity in Texas Stadium. Eules won the state championship that year.

Coach Grijalva was named “Coach of the Year” by several media outlets in 2001, 2002, 2003 and 2005. In 2005, he was named Regional Coach of the Year by Texas High School Football. Coach Grijalva has had the pleasure of coaching many great athletes that received all-district, all-city and all-state honors.

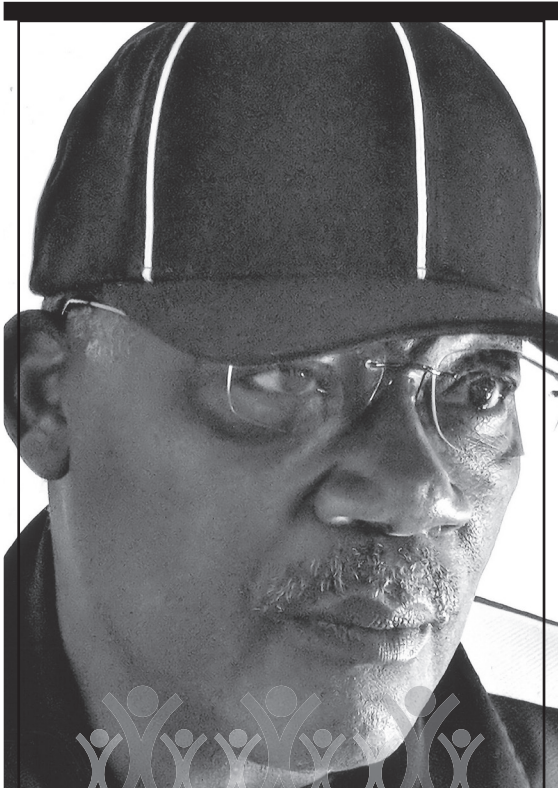


MILTON HENRY

COACH

Coach Henry began his coaching career in 1968 as a volunteer coach and officially began coaching in 1971 at Parkland High School. In 1972, he was made the defensive coordinator for the varsity football team. That year, they were the district champions. His tenure with the football team continued through 1978. After a short stint at Irvin High School, he went to Burges High School to become the varsity football offensive coordinator and varsity boy's track coach. He became the head football coach in 1983 and continued as such to 1993. Under his direction, they earned the title of District Champions in the 1992-1993 season, as well as, winning the “El Paso Coach of the Year” award. During that time, he was also involved in the El Paso Coaching Association, serving as president in 1983. In 1993, he opened Franklin High School with freshman. They became District Champions in the

1996-97, 1997-98 and 1998-99 seasons. During coach Henry's final season, his defense, nicknamed the “Black Swarm”, held their opponents to 0 points, while his offense scored 214, a feat not done before. During the course of Milton Henry's 32-year coaching career, he led by example. His moral character, commitment to the game, to his players and families, and his integrity were a large part of his success. One of his greatest values was sportsmanship. The lessons he taught are still valid today and can be seen in the many students and athletes he influenced.



ROBERT HEMPHILL, JR.

OFFICIAL

Robert Hemphill, Jr., a native of Eagle Lake, Texas was born in Houston, Texas on Thanksgiving Day in 1950. Robert is a thirty-six-year veteran high school football official with playoff experience at the district, bi-district, area, regional and state levels. He started working high school football games as a Division 1 official with crew chief Bernie Del Hierro in 1982. His assignments included working as umpire in county games, the semi-professional football league in El Paso, the white hat in one Ysleta High varsity game, the city leagues, middle school, freshmen and junior varsity levels. Robert was frequently assigned to officiate in the Sun Bowl's City All Star Games. He worked a UTEP scrimmage and several college level games in Mexico. Hemphill was a member of the Texas Association of Sports Officials.

Robert lived a life devoted to community service whether in the classroom or on the football field. He mentored many

in leadership development and community service. Robert served a year in the United States Army Reserves and seventeen years in the Texas State Guard. Major Hemphill (Lt. Col. Eligible) became the commander of the 39th Battalion and received an honorable discharge for his services.

Robert earned a Master's Degree from the University of Texas at El Paso in 1976, where he taught in the Teacher Education Department for 18 years (1998-2016). Dr. Hemphill earned a Doctorate of Philosophy from New Mexico State University in 1996.

Dr. Hemphill is highly regarded in the El Paso community for his volunteerism and mentorship. He retired from El Paso ISD after 39 years as a high school administrator (at all levels). He became a licensed United Methodist Church Pastor in 2015 with membership in the New Mexico Annual Conference-El Paso District.



OSCAR LEESER

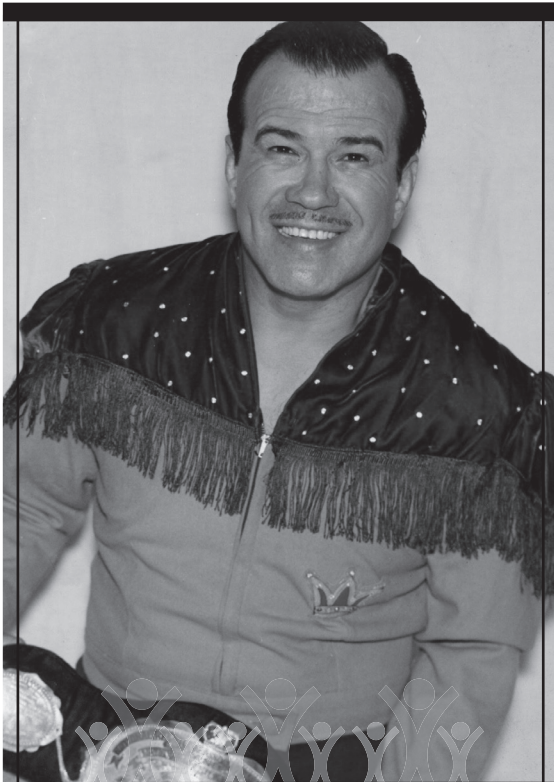
SUPPORTER OF ATHLETICS

Oscar Leeser was born in Mexico and immigrated to the United States with his family at the age of 9, residing in El Paso, Texas. Leeser began his career in the auto industry in 1979 at Kemp Ford. In 2001, he became the owner of Hyundai of El Paso. He turned a dealership that was selling only 15 cars a month into today's number one overall dealer in El Paso: selling over 400 cars a month. His dealership is one of the top Hyundai dealers in the south-central region and one of the largest Hyundai dealers in the country. He amassed over four decades of experience in business, culminating in his service as owner and President of Hyundai of El Paso prior to becoming mayor. Mayor Leeser has a strong dedication to his community.

Mayor Oscar Leeser has contributed time and money to many local organizations. Hyundai of El Paso was the longest running title sponsor of the Oscar Leeser Hyundai of El Paso Sun

Bowl for 9 years. During those years he provided cars for team use. He donated over 500 tickets per year for first responders to attend the Sun Bowl game. Mayor Leeser is a UTEP athletic supporter; he has donated cars for the past 20 years to various coaches. The mayor is a proud sponsor of youth sports. He has provided support to the Canutillo High School dance team, the Andress High School basketball team, Coronado High School football, baseball and golf teams, and the Cathedral High School golf team. Oscar also is a sponsor of the Miracle League of El Paso, Southwest Baseball League and the El Paso Classic Soccer League. He has coached and umpired little league baseball, basketball and football in El Paso for over 15 years.

Mayor Leeser is currently the sponsor of the Oscar Leeser Hyundai of El Paso Sun Bowl parade and the Greater El Paso Football Showcase All-Star draft.



SALVADOR "GORY" GUERRERO

POSTHUMOUS

Salvador "Gory" Guerrero was born in Ray, Arizona on January 11, 1921. He was an acclaimed international wrestler in the U.S. and Mexico. He won numerous wrestling championships and has been honored by several wrestling organizations, including the Cauliflower Alley Club, Salon De La Fama: Lucha Libre de Mexico and the Professional Wrestling Hall of Fame (class of 2019).

Gory was also a successful wrestling promoter. His promotions company, Guerrero Resources Inc., was a family affair, involving his wife (Herlinda), his four professional wrestler sons (Chavo, Mando, Hector and Eddie) and his two daughters (Maria and Linda). He ran promotions in El Paso for 22 years at the El Paso Coliseum and later at the El Paso Convention Center. He also promoted

in Juarez, Mexico – making him the only person to promote wrestling simultaneously in two countries.

Gory loved his El Paso community. He was a member of Trinity Baptist Church, a supporter of local orphanages, the Optimist Club and the Lions Club and he donated his time and talents to school fundraisers across the city. He provided free wrestling shows at Washington Park for senior citizens and friends, and he set up a wrestling ring to instruct upcoming wrestlers in the San Juan Civic Center, which the Boys Club also used. Later in life, Gory pursued a career in insurance, eventually owning his own bail bonds company, SOS Bail bonds. Gory passed away on April 17, 1990 and is buried at Evergreen Cemetery in El Paso.
