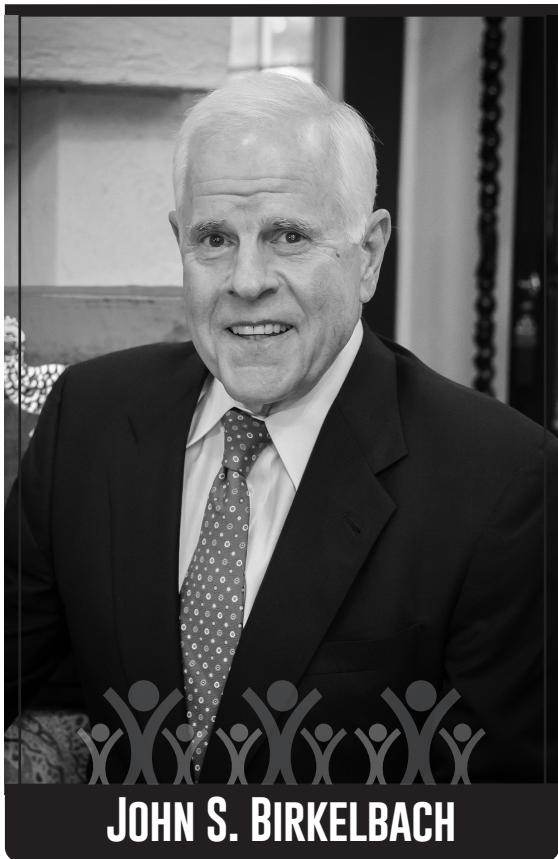

**EL PASO ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME

JOHN S. BIRKELBACH

ATHLETE

Mr. Birkelbach is a lifetime resident of El Paso County, Texas, having attended Crockett Elementary School, Basset Intermediate School, Austin High School and the University of Texas at El Paso. He received his Doctorate of Jurisprudence Degree from the University of Texas at Austin in 1974 and is a shareholder in the law firm of Mounce, Green, Myers, Safi, Paxson & Galatzan, PC. He has also been listed in "Best Lawyers of America" since 1993.

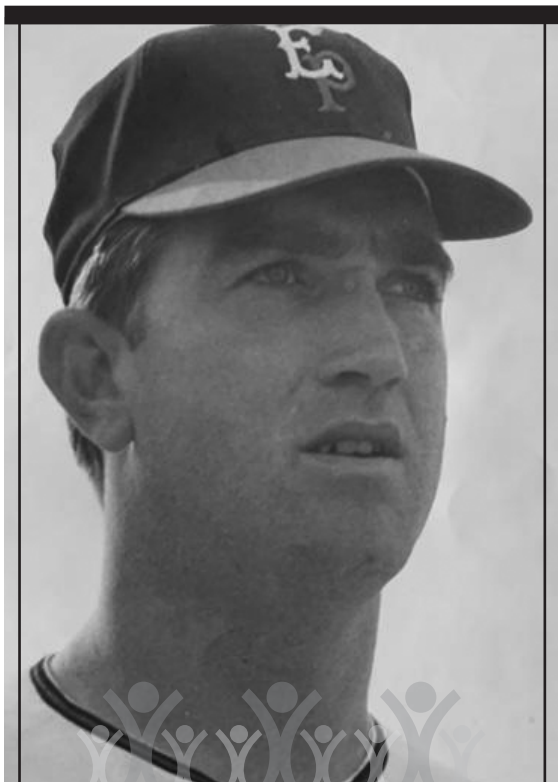
He was a multi-sport athlete in high school but was introduced to the shot-put in an unusual but fortuitous circumstance. John's brother Charlie was 6'5", weighed 215 and was a shot-putter on the track team. After spring training basketball, John had to wait for his brother to complete practice to get a ride home. While waiting, he wandered into the shot-put ring and with nothing else to do, he threw the shot from the front of the ring and further than all of the other upper classmen. Coach Watkins had witnessed the throw and two days later, John finished runner-up in the shot-put in the B-Team City Championships.

Following knee surgery after his freshman year, John concentrated on the shot-put and discus. By the end of his senior year, John was

the first El Paso athlete to exceed 60 feet in the shot-put and had the second best throw among shot-putters in the state of Texas. He was the district champion in both the shot-put and discus, regional champion in the shot-put and runner-up in the state track meet in the shot-put. He still holds the shot-put record at Austin High School.

John continued his track endeavors at the University of Texas at El Paso, where he held the school record in the shot-put his first and second years; finished 6th in the NCAA Indoor Championships in 1968 and 1969, and 8th in the NCAA Outdoor Championships in 1968; had the second best shot-put throw among all college freshman (1968); won the WAC Relays in 1968; was runner-up in the 1968 Texas Relays; won the WAC Championship in 1969, and won the United States Track & Field Federation Championship in 1969. He was a member of only the second university team to have three 60 foot shot-putters at the same time.

John recently celebrated his 50th anniversary of marriage to his beloved wife Bonnie and has three children, David, Michael (Lucia) and Tristan (Johnathan) and three lovely granddaughters.



JOE OVERTON

ATHLETE

Joe began his athletic career in Greenville, Mississippi, where he grew up playing both baseball and football. These early years were capped off with the state championship for this starting senior quarterback, earning both all-state and MVP honors.

These early successes led to a football scholarship to Auburn University under the tutelage of legendary coach Shug Jordan, while at the same time performing double-duty as a starting pitcher on the Southeastern Conference championship team, whereby he earned MVP honors for the conference.

In 1963, Joe signed his first professional baseball contract with the San Francisco Giants and was sent to Springfield, Massachusetts to begin his professional career in the Eastern League. The next year, in 1964, he led the Eastern League with an ERA of 1.72, thus earning a promotion to Tacoma, of the Pacific Coast League where he won

14 games. The strong outings in Tacoma moved him to the major league team in San Francisco.

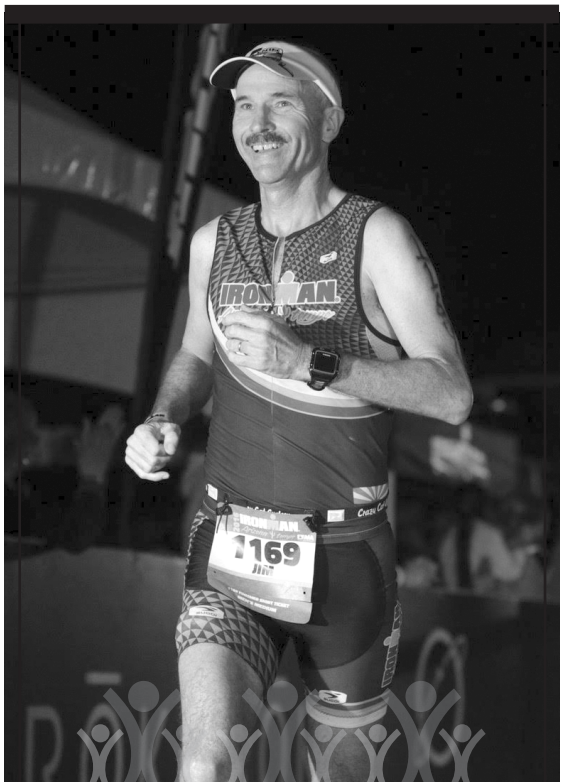
The next couple of years saw stops in Phoenix, Arizona, winter ball in the Dominican Republic, and a trade to the California Angels organization in Seattle, Washington.

The baseball season of 1968 and 1969 brought Joe to El Paso, where he played his last two professional years with the El Paso Sun Kings.

After his professional baseball career, Joe spent the next 35 years as a teacher and coach in the El Paso Independent School District, teaching and coaching at Mesita, Vilas, Coronado, and El Paso High.

In 1995, he was honored by being named to the El Paso Baseball Hall of Fame, and in 2009, Vilas named their athletic wing after him.

Joe has been married for 57 years to Nancy, has a daughter, Romi Schwartz, and a son, Joe Overton, Jr.



JIM WEDDELL

ATHLETE

In 2005, Jim Weddell started running after struggling to keep up with his son in one-on-one basketball. He jogged a bit, then set a goal of running a sub-4-hour marathon. At age 42, he finished the San Diego Marathon in 3:46. Now, 72 marathons later, that first goal seems...cute.

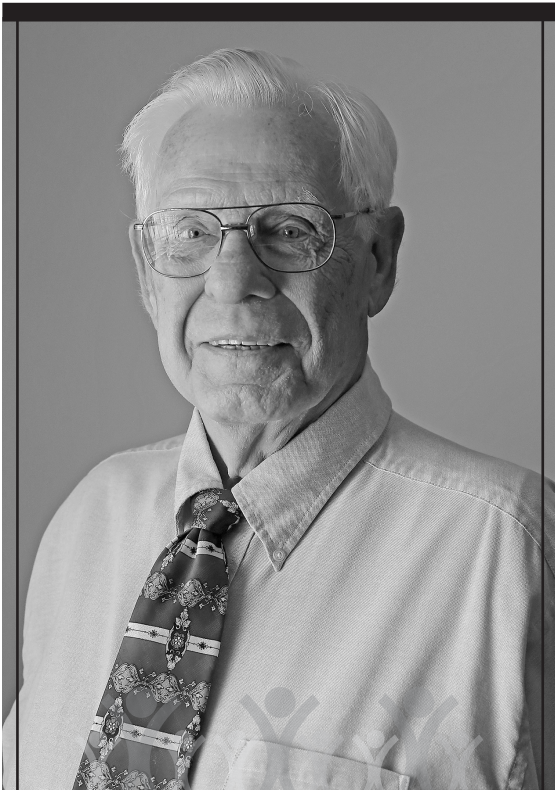
Jim has qualified for the Boston Marathon 49 times and New York Marathon 22 times, more than any El Pasoan. He has run sub-3-hour marathons (2:59:57 in Houston 2012 and 2:59:06 in Boston 2013), a challenge for any runner, and a rarity for a runner over 50.

He has completed more El Paso Marathons than anyone, often finishing in the top 10. He has led Run El Paso to team victories at the El Paso Marathon and Bataan Memorial Death March.

Jim has run one 100 mile race, eight trail ultramarathons, six full Ironman triathlons, and six half Ironman triathlons. He was invited twice to Ironman 70.3-mile World Championships.

His support for running includes years on The El Paso Marathon and Run El Paso boards, and terms as Run El Paso president.

Jim was born and raised in San Diego. He has a bachelors degree from the University of California, Santa Cruz, and a masters degree from UTEP. He has worked as an ESL instructor, a journalist, and marketer. He and his wife Carmen, moved to El Paso in 1992 and have two children, Cecilia and Mario, and a grandchild, Diego.



ERWIN A. BLOXDORF

COACH

Erwin A. Bloxdorf was born in Erie, Pennsylvania in 1937. He graduated from Academy High School and Edinboro State College. He was introduced to wrestling by his science teacher Harry Ramsey, who coached him in high school and college. He was a city and district wrestling champion and an all-city football player. He was named most outstanding athlete in high school. In 1960, he was drafted into the U.S. Army where he won the Fort Dix wrestling tournament.

While stationed at Fort Bliss in 1962, he met and married his wife Guadalupe. They decided to make El Paso their home. He began his teaching and coaching career at Burnet Elementary School. In 1964, he was asked by Ted Kepple to coach the wrestling team at Irvin High School. He made a huge impact on the sport of wrestling in El Paso and the state of Texas. From 1964-72 his teams dom-

inated competition in El Paso and New Mexico, recording winning seasons every year.

In 1972, the individual El Paso city champions were finally invited to compete in the state championships in Amarillo. Six of the twelve member contingents were Irvin wrestlers as the El Paso wrestlers dominated and brought home the state championship trophy. Four state champions were crowned from Irvin. Irvin went on to win back-to-back state championships. After leaving wrestling in 1972, Coach Bloxdorf returned to coach wrestling from 1976-78 and was inducted in the Texas High School Wrestling Hall of Honor in 1987.

Erwin is the son of Alfred and Anny Bloxdorf, and has a brother Raymond. He and his wife, Guadalupe have three sons, Andrew, Raymond, and Michael, along with two grandchildren, Brandon and Ashley.



MARIA KENNEDY

ADMINISTRATION

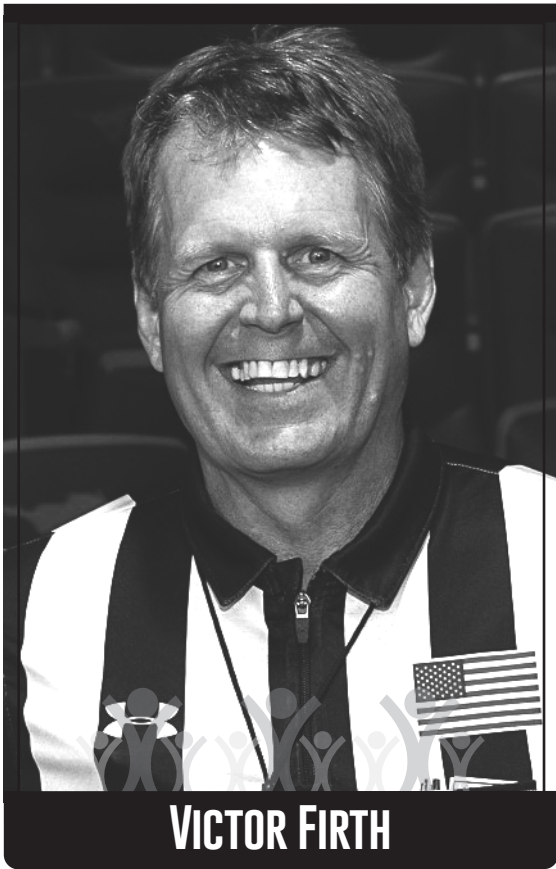
Maria Kennedy was born on July 10, 1960, in Pecos, Texas. She has been married to Aubrey Kennedy for 35 years. They have two children Isaiah Kennedy and Macey Downing, who is married to Justin Downing. They have five grandchildren Michael Juarez, Marko Kennedy, Alissa Kennedy, Taylor Downing, and Harper Downing.

Kennedy attended Van Horn High School, where she graduated in 1978 receiving her bachelor's and Master's Degree from Sul Ross State University.

Kennedy has spent twenty years coaching various sports in Victoria, Texas, Andrews, Texas and then El Paso at Coldwell, Irvin High School, and Franklin High School. In 1997 and 1998, she was the El Paso Times Coach of the Year for the girls' varsity basketball team at Franklin High School.

In 2016, she moved to the Athletic Office as an assistant under Kenneth Owen. In January of 2016, she was named the interim until August, when she was announced as the director. During this time, she was a member of the Texas High School Athletic Directors Association, National Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association, Texas Girls Coaches Association, and the Texas High school Coaches Association.

Kennedy has served as the THSADA Region IV Director for three years and in 2018 she was the Region IV Director of the Year. In 2019, Kennedy received the Margaret Mc Kowen distinguished service award from TGCA. In addition, she has served on the Urban ISD committee for THSCA. In 2020, UTEP honored her with the National Girl's and Women's Day in Sports Circle of Excellence award.



VICTOR FIRTH

OFFICIAL

A native El Pasoan, Victor graduated from Eastwood High and obtained a bachelor's degree in finance with a 4.0 GPA as one of UTEP's top ten graduating seniors. Victor then earned his law degree from the University of Texas.

Licensed in both Oklahoma and Texas, Victor's practice is focused in lending, commercial and real estate law. He founded his own firm over 20 years ago, now called Firth, Bunn, Kerr and Neill.

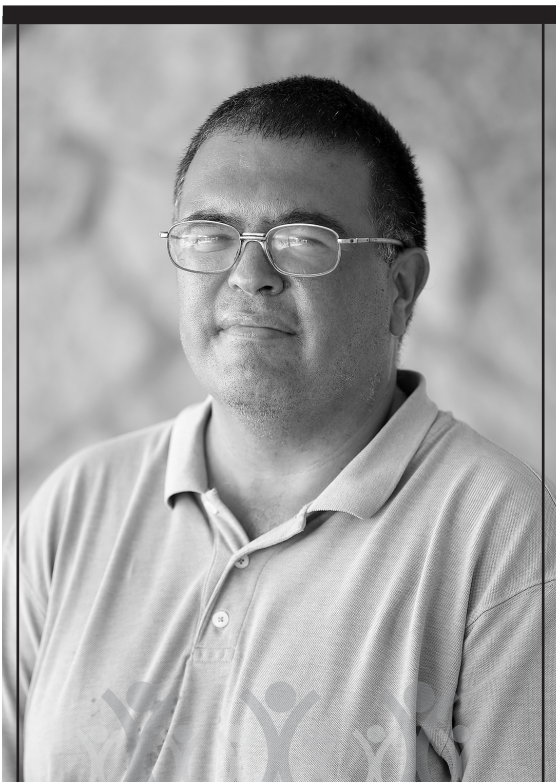
Victor started football officiating in 1988, working area school district games. He got his break into Division 1 (now FBS) collegiate football as one of the first group of officials hired into the Sun Belt Conference when it sponsored football in 2001.

Victor later moved on to the Western Athletic Conference, officiating

games that included stops in Las Cruces for NMSU, up to the blue turf at Boise State and at least one game each year in Honolulu. A personal highlight during these years in the WAC was officiating the battle of I-10 in the Sun Bowl back in 2012.

After the WAC disbanded, Victor moved on to the American Athletic Conference, where he continues to work in classic stadiums around the country, including Penn State, Florida State and Notre Dame, even calling a game played at Fenway Park. Victor also has officiated 9 post-season bowl and conference championship games.

Victor has been married for 35 years to Sylvia Borunda Firth, former City Attorney for El Paso and currently the 2021-22 President of the Texas State Bar Association.

Charlie Brown was born on July 14, 1949 and was a longtime resident of El Paso. He was born to Kenneth Charles Brown and Iva Pearl Brown. He graduated from Burges High school in 1967 then attended New Mexico where he played football. Eventually he made his way back to El Paso to finish his degree at UTEP and upon his completion of his degree he followed the example of his father, K.C Brown and chose to be a coach in the El Paso community.

Coach Brown married Vickie Cardon in 1973 they were married for 48 years having six children and seven grandchildren. They lost one of their sons Kenneth a beloved student at Eastwood High School just weeks before his high school graduation.

Known as the master motivator, well-respected and a friend to all in the coaching community, Coach Brown made his rounds through the coaching realms of El Paso. With stops at Austin, Burges, Socorro, Aledo, Burges again, El Paso High, Montwood, Santa Teresa, Cathedral and

Fabens, Coach Brown left his mark along the way. Charlie Brown was a man of action, determination and love. He made you believe in yourself and that you had all the ability in the world to succeed.

Coach Brown never stopped working and finding opportunities to coach. From the beginning of his career to the very end, he loved, guided and inspired all he came in contact with.

On November 7, 2020 he lost his battle to Covid 19. His discipline and work ethic was still on display each day towards the end of his life as he detailed his goals and schedule to recovery and what he was being taught. Never to bring to attention to himself, he looked for ways to help and inspire others and upon his hopeful recovery, he was determined to help those in need.

Coach Brown will always be the greatest example of a great man and a hall of fame coach. Thank you for honoring him tonight.
