50 Year Anniversary of Title IX Honored at El Paso Athletic Hall of Fame Banquet



On June 23, 1972, Title IX was signed into law enabling girls and women to have the same opportunities in sports as boys and men. Congress passed Title IX in response to the marked educational inequalities women faced prior to the 1970's.

Tonight, we honor one of the first women's teams in UTEP Athletics History with the 1974-75 Womens Basketball Team who along with the 1974-1975 UTEP Women's Volleyball Team were groundbreakers, paving the way for countless opportunities for UTEP female student-athletes for many years to come.

EL PASO ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME HONORES 2022





Jim Bowden was born and raised in El Paso, graduated from Eastwood High School in 1976 and The University of Texas at El Paso in 1980. He completed his Doctor of Dental Surgery degree from The University of Texas Dental School in San Antonio in 1984. Dr. Bowden then went on to receive additional specialty training in Pediatric Dentistry and Orthodontics. He has owned a private practice in El Paso for over 35 years.

Jim was team captain and leading scorer of the 1976 UIL Class 4-A Texas State basketball championship team at Eastwood High School; the only high school basketball team from El Paso to win a state championship in the past 75 years.

After his basketball career came to an end, he spent more than 30 years as an avid runner and multi-sport athlete; running, biking and swimming. He completed fifteen full 26.2-mile marathons which included the "Big Four"-New York City Marathon (3 times). Boston Marathon.

Chicago Marathon and the Marine Corp Marathon in Washington D.C. Jim completed three 70.3-mile half ironman races which consist of a 1.2-mile swim, a 56-mile bike ride and a 13.1- mile run and over 120 short course triathlons, duathlons and various road races.

As a professional, Dr. Bowden has committed to giving back to the El Paso community for over 35 years through donated time, talent, resources and money to numerous causes to help improve the lives of others. Through visibility in the community as an ex-athlete, he has always had a personal mission to use success in athletics as a platform to positively impact others.

Jim has been married to his wife Karen for almost twenty-eight years. They have a daughter, Campbell, who was a standout volleyball player for Coronado High School. She then went on to play volleyball for Baylor University and recently graduated with a degree in Kinesiology.




Steven Lee was born in St. Louis, Missouri where he eventually moved to El Paso in 1983 and attended Austin High School. While at Austin he was a three-year letterman in track and two-year letterman in football. Steven Lee held the El Paso single season record of twen- ty-nine touchdowns until it was recently broken. During his junior year he won various honors which included All-City, All-District, Player of the Year, and two-time Sunturian Amateur Athlete of the Month. His senior year (1985-1986) he had a record-breaking season winning multiple titles including the 5-A state single game rushing record of 419 yards and the El Paso single season rushing record of 2626 yards. He was also awarded All City, All District and Player of the Year for KVIA - TV, El Paso Herald Post and El Paso Times Newspapers.

He was also selected Sportsman of the Year by the El Paso Herald Post and first team 1-5A All State running back. As a three- year track athlete, he was a two-time District Champion in the 110 hurdles and long jump and a district champion in the 300 hurdles.

Steven attended Angelo State University where he was a four-year letterman and helped the team to numerous conference champion- ships and playoff appearances. He was also selected to the Angelo State All-Decade Team.

After a brief stint in semi - pro football, he later joined the military and served for nine years in the United States Navy. He later returned to El Paso where he started his coaching career and is the current head girls' basketball coach at Pebble Hills High School.






Kenny Lucero was inspired to run by his siblings, Sharon and Gavin, and parents Alfred and Janet. Although Kenny played basketball at Coronado High School he ran his senior year at the urging of Coach Jeff Dember while Kenny's dad convinced him to run, forever changing his life. Lucero was the 1986 District Cross-Country Champion, helping Coronado win their first title and placed 2nd at Regionals and 6th at State. In track, Kenny won the District 3200m, was 2nd at regionals, and 7th at State. One incident occurred in the 1600m at District, "Kenny got spiked at the beginning of the race and his shoe was knocked off and he still completed the race and nearly qualified for regionas" according to Coronado Track Coach Bruce Gordon.

Lucero, committed to UTEP after being recruited by Texas, Texas A&M, Texas Tech, and Kansas as his heroes were UTEP greats Suleiman Nyambui, Michael Musyoki, and Wilson Waigwa. As a freshman, Kenny admired the All-American certificates on the wall of the track office, making that his goal. Lucero was considered by Coach Bob Kitchens to be one of his most steady and dependable performers. Kenny's accomplishments included winning 3 Conference USA 5.000m titles, earning All-Conference 16 times, selected UTEP's Cross-Country MVP twice, and earning All-American, and finishing 15th place at the 1991 NCAA Cross-Country Championships. Coach Kitchens asserted that Lucero's race could be the inspiration for future UTEP Cross Country teams as Kenny is the 2nd native El Pasoan to earn Cross-Country All-American at UTEP with Tony Zuniga being the first in 1975.

Kenny is a Marketing Teacher, DECA Advisor, and Cross Country Coach at Americas High School. He was named Teacher of the Year there in 2010. He earned a Master's Degree in Organizational Management in 2003 from the University of Phoenix and is married to Erika with two daughters, Sophia (13), and Kennedy (8).



David Moore grew up in the lower valley of El Paso attending Ysleta High School from 1963-1967 where he played basketball, baseball, and ran track. He then went on to play basketball at Tarleton State University from 1967-1969 before transferring in 1970 to Western New Mexico where he earned his Bachelor's and Master's degree while playing basketball and baseball.

In 1973, Coach Moore began his coaching career in football, basketball, and track at South Loop Elementary School. In the fall of 1975, he transferred to Ysleta High School where he coached 9th grade football and basketball.

In 1977, Coach Moore began his varsity coaching career as the new boys' basketball coach at Clint High School along with coaching football and golf.


As a golf coach for 27 years, his boys' and girls' teams combined for 13 district championships. His teams went to

regionals 29 times including 6 boy's teams and 15 girl's teams as well as eight individual qualifiers. Three of those individuals won regionals, advancing to the State Tournament, with one individual winning a state title.

In 25 years as the boys' varsity basket- ball coach his teams advanced to the state playoffs 19 times. They won 11 District Championships, nine Bi-District Championships, two Area Championships, a Regional runner-up, a regional Championship and State Final Four appearance.

Combined, his golf teams and basket-ball teams advanced past district play 48 times; winning 35 team championships. One of the biggest highlights of his career was when the 1992 boys' basket-ball team received the Horlen-Neely Sportsmanship Award for the State of Texas in Class 3A presented by the Southwestern Basketball Officials Association.





Wright Stanton III was born in Osaka, Japan in 1951 and later received a Bachelor of Science degree in Community Recreation Education from the University of Virginia. Wright was introduced to swimming in college as part of his work-study as a lifeguard, meanwhile competing in a segregated conference and becoming an All-CIAA selection.

Coach Stanton III went on to become a captain in the United States Army and later was the aquatics director for both Ft. Bliss and the City of El Paso. Wright currently coaches the Barracudas swim team and the Southwest Aquatics team in El Paso. His vast knowledge of swimming has enabled many of his athletes to obtain time qualification standards for 12 Texas age group championship meets, 15 sectionals, one future series, five junior nationals, one grand prix, and four senior circuits. He has produced many collegiate evel swimmers such as Jake

Hartley, Samantha Wilts, and Lara Jackson. Wright has also coached in over 20 U.S. Master National meets and World Championships achieving multiple top ten finishes.

Wright has been a volunteer instructor for the American Red Cross since 1972 and has received the highest award given "The Certificate of Merit". Wright has also been a volunteer for the Ft. Bliss Chapel Praise Team and for Youth Services. He has coached high school and middle school track and field, swimming, baseball, basketball, and football while also participating in the El Paso and Texas Senior Games where he holds over twenty-seven records.

Wright Stanton III is married to Arleen Townsend Stanton and their three children have followed in Dad's footsteps becoming coaches themselves while the Stanton's also have six grandchildren.




Chris Snead is a native of El Paso, Texas graduating from J.M. Hanks High School in 1987. His officiating career began with a response to an advertisement at the student recreation center in college the fall of 1988 when he first took the field as a flag football official.

In 1995, Snead began his high school football career and as it was in baseball, he progressed quickly, moving to the referee position, and becoming the crew chief of choice in West Texas in a career that would culminate with over 50 postseason assignments, including back-to-back years as the crew chief in the UIL 4A state championship games in 2010 and 2011. He would eventually get the break he needed when he was asked to become a Referee and Crew Chief in Conference USA where he was able to return once again to El Paso as a referee at the Sun Bowl for a UTEP football game versus Tulane in the fall of 2012.

However, Snead's officiating success was not nearly over, after two seasons in C-USA, he was invited to become the first ever Center Judge in the Southeastern Conference. Snead was a member of the officiating crew of the first ever College Football Playoff game in the Rose Bowl on January 1, 2015 between Florida State and Oregon. He was also the Center Judge in the 2016 Alamo Bowl that was the largest comeback in NCAA bowl game history. Additionally, he officiated conference championship games in 2016 and 2018 with an assignment to a New Year's Six Orange Bowl in 2017. In April of 2016, Snead was named Outstanding Football Official by the National Football Foundation. In 2019, Snead was selected to work the Quick Lane Bowl in Detroit and that was followed by bowl assignments in 2020 in the Guarantee Rate Bowl which was cancelled due to the pandemic, and the 2021 First Responder Bowl.






Before Brain Kennedy decided to become a lawyer at age 63, he was a personal body-guard for Prince and Rod Stewart; a helicopter pilot; served in the military intelligence as an interpreter and interrogator who spoke five languages; a sharp- shooter; a nationally recognized top country radio disc jockey; a professional poker player; a recognized sports, events and entertainment contract negotiator; winner of an international negotiation competition and a leading promoter of concerts and events

As CEO of the El Paso Sports Commission and the El Paso Coliseum for over two decades, he was responsible for the operations of a multi-million-dollar private public partnership turning the coliseum into one of the most highly booked venues of its size in the southwest.

Brian Kennedy brings his game, his wit, his creativity, and his uncanny

ability to find solutions long after everyone else has left the room. Through his tenacity, relationship building, and negotiation skills, sports tourism came to El Paso including the United States Bowling Congress Women's Championship in 2011, the USBC Open Championship in 2015 and the Conference USA Basketball Tournaments in 2011 and 2014 which resulted in hundreds of millions of dollars in sports tourism for our community.

Whether it was figure skating, flag football, basketball, youth circuit fencing, junior college track and field, hockey, wrestling, boxing, martial arts, bull riding, cycling, triathlons, indoor soccer, slow-pitch softball, cheerleading and more; there is scarcely a kid in sports in El Paso that has not been touched by Brian Kennedy's accommodating dedication to often over-looked community sports.



"Coach" Bruce Gordon passed away August 20, 2016. He grew up in El Paso, and sports was a major focus in his life. He was involved in sports as early as elementary school. He played football at Sul Ross State University in Alpine but finished his education with a bachelor's degree in biology and a master's degree in education from UTEP.

Bruce began his 33-year teaching and coaching career at Canutillo High School before other coaching stints at Ross Junior High, Coronado High School, and Austin High School. In addition to coaching, Bruce taught biology, integrated physics and chemistry, and anatomy.

Among career highlights, Bruce coached over 30 all-district football players and over 185 district track champions. The JV track teams at

Coronado hold five district records and the varsity teams hold three district records. Track and Field runners and relay teams coached by Bruce ranked at both state and national levels and in 1991 one of his athletes set a national record in the 400-meter hurdles.

Bruce's favorite and primary roles were that of husband, father, son, grandfather, brother, cousin, uncle, and friend -- but the role of Coach always touched him. Coach led by example and with humor and his students continually quote his witty "Gordonisms." Coach touched the lives of his students, many of whom came back to let him know that their accomplishments were due to the leadership, discipline, unity, camaraderie, and work ethic he instilled. The stories and memories students shared were some of his proudest moments.
