Edmundo obtained his Bachelor Degree majoring in Accounting from UTEP in 1980 and his Master Degree in 1999 from The University of Phoenix.

Edmundo is married to Camille Calderon and they currently live in El Paso, TX. They have a daughter, son-in-law, and 2 granddaughters living in Cibolo, TX.

Edmundo "Mundo" Calderon is currently the City Auditor for the City of El Paso. He has been the City Auditor for 17 years. He has been an auditor for over 35 years and has worked for General Motors, First Light Federal Credit Union, UTEP, and City of El Paso. His reputation an as auditor is well-known throughout the country as he has sat on numerous national boards and committees. He is a Certified Internal Auditor, Certified Government Auditing Professional, and Certified in Risk Management Assurance.

High School Football Official 1988-2008

Because for his love of football, Mundo began a distinguished career in football officiating. Mundo began his football officiating career in 1988 when he joined the El Paso Chapter of the Southwest Football Officials Association. He officiated football games for every area school districts in El Paso County. He officiated for 21 years and ended his career after the 2008 season due to series of recurring injuries. It was during these 21 years that Mundo worked over 800 football games for the area school districts. He completed his officiating career as a Division 1 Level Official, which is the highest rating an individual can attain in Texas.

- Officiated over 800 football games for area school districts.
- Officiated the first game played at the Socorro ISD, SAC Stadium in 1995.
- Selected to work area playoffs games on 3 separate seasons.
- In 2001, selected to officiate a State Quarter Final Game, Andrews High versus Southlake Carroll High played at Radcliff Stadium in Odessa, TX.
- Selected to officiate 2 Greater El Paso Football Showcase All-Star Games.
- From 2000-2005, assisted UTEP with preseason scrimmages held in Socorro, NM.

Junior College Football Official 2004-2005

From 2004 to 2005, Mundo Calderon worked in the Western States Football League for 2 seasons officiating Junior College Football Games. For the 2004 & 2005 Seasons, Mundo officiated JUCO football games for teams from Arizona, Utah, and New Mexico.

Here are some highlights from Mundo's JUCO Officiating Career:

- For the 2004 & 2005 Seasons, worked JUCO Football Games for the Western States Football League. The games officiated were played mostly in Roswell, New Mexico on the New Mexico Military Institute (NMMI) campus.
- In 2004, was selected to officiate a non-conference football game between NMMI and Monterrey Tech Borregos from Monterrey, Mexico. The game was officiated in both English and Spanish as the Monterrey Tech's coaching staff did not speak English. The game was played in Cloudcroft, NM as a neutral site. Being Bilingual, Mundo worked as the Umpire in order to communicate with both teams.

Football Game Score Keeper 2014-Present

In 2014 after 6 years away from the game, Mundo Calderon received an offer from the late Bob Ludwig to assist operating the Scoreboard at UTEP helping with score keeping and game clocks. As a former football official it was a natural fit. Mundo Calderon joined the Scoreboard Crew working with Bob Ludwig, Richard Perez, and Randy Crossland. For the last 8 years, Mundo Calderon has helped keep score and operate the game clocks for UTEP home games, the annual Sun Bowl Game, EPISD games, and the annual High School All-Star Game.

Here are some highlights from Mundo Calderon's Football Score Keeping career:

- From 2014-2021, has worked 8 Football Seasons for UTEP. All the games were played at the Sun Bowl.
- From 2014-2021, has worked 7 Sun Bowl Games. The 2020 Sun Bowl Game was cancelled due to the COVID-19 Pandemic.
- From 2014-2021, has worked the annual Westside Bowl between Franklin High and Coronado High played at the Sun Bowl.
- From 2014-2021, has worked the annual Southside Bowl between Bowie High and Jefferson High played at the Sun Bowl.
- From 2014-2019, has worked the annual High School All-Star Game played at the Sun Bowl.
- From 2014-2021, has worked football games for EPISD. Having worked as the Score Keeper at Irvin, Andress, Austin, El Paso High, Jefferson, and Bowie.
- For the 2021 Spring Season, worked the New Mexico State University Spring Games played at the Sun Bowl.
