My family saw a lot of the western United States while I was growing up. We settled in Kingman, Arizona, when my brothers and I were of "junior high" age. As a freshman, I was unsuccessful playing football, but had a great time serving as manager of the baseball team.

The freshman baseball coach happened to be the head football coach and he set me up with the Cramer Student Trainer Course: "Athletic Training in the Seventies", which I completed in the summer of 1970. I had a great time helping my friends, most of whom played two or three sports. In the summers, I attended student athletic trainer workshops at both Northern Arizona University and the University of Arizona.

I chose to attend NAU to work with Mike Nesbitt as an intern. We had a very small but outstanding staff. It was Mike and the student trainers; no assistants, and, for awhile, not even a graduate assistant. So, we did the job, and learned on the run. Mike emphasized classroom excellence and two of my fellow students received academic recognition from the NATA. This has been an NAU tradition, ever since. Mike also made sure we had a teaching credential; that was where the jobs were and athletic trainers "need to be on the faculty". In 1976, I was named outstanding graduate in Physical Education.

Phil Voorheis and I were accepted into Dr. Gary Delforge's graduate program at the University of Arizona. The class of 1977 consisted of twenty one students, from all over the country. I was assigned to work at the University, with Warren Lee. Having such a small program was a tremendous advantage. At that time, it was an extremely intense, one year program and we needed each other's support. Because of its small size, however, the University dropped it in 19--. Dr. Delforge then demonstrated a central characteristic of our profession, he figured out how to get the job done anyway. It is now, an even better, two year program at the Arizona School of Health Sciences in Chandler, Arizona. I consider myself to be the luckiest athletic trainer on the planet. I learned my profession from Mike Nesbitt, Warren Lee and Gary Delforge; all of whom are enshrined in the National Athletic Trainers Association Hall of Fame.

Then, it was time to find a job. Phil and I sent dozens of letters to small colleges throughout the western United States. We each wanted to find a little NAU of our own. Bob Beeten, in Colorado Springs invited me to come to the olympic training center. I could sleep in a dorm and eat in the cafeteria, but there was no salaried position. Because Phil was an Eastwood graduate, we sent applications to the El Paso area. Ruth Meredith called and offered Parkland High School.

I accepted the paying job; the training center would always be there, and one of my great regrets is that I never followed up. The first year at Parkland was very tough. Fortunately, in those days, the athletic program was small and I learned how to cope. Teaching Biology was a different matter; I survived that thanks to Milton Henry.

The following year, an extraordinary group of professionals began showing up at Parkland. We were a small school playing a 5A schedule but we started to have fun, and we started to win. When Cyndi Rains became my partner, she and I were able to expand and improve the sports health program and I started to enjoy success teaching, as well. In 1993, Corine and I married and life was very good, indeed.

There were many changes at Parkland over the eighteen years, and in 1995, I transferred to Riverside. In 1996, several of my old friends reunited at Fabens High School and I was invited to come along. In the summer of 2000, Tom Redlinger called for me to fill a vacancy at Montwood High and I am ever grateful to him and Cheryl Hochhalter for teaching me how the big schools have to operate, in a district progressive enough to have three athletic trainers on staff.

In 2001, I was elected to serve the athletic trainers in far west Texas on the Board of the new Texas State Athletic Trainers Association. Serving in this capacity has allowed me to meet many outstanding athletic trainers across the state. It rejuvenated my enthusiasm for our great profession. Presently, I work at Socorro High School in the finest sports health facility I have seen in any high school, anywhere in the country.
