

# EL PASO ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME INDUCTES 2024



Patsy Norman, born to Julio and Consuelo Norman of El Paso, is the youngest of eight children. The Normans were a running dynasty at El Paso High during the 1970s. Patsy's six older brothers were all runners with the family standouts being Rene, Danny, and Victor – each earning All-State honors.


Patsy Norman, coached Danny McKillip (XC) and Irene Ariza (track), was undefeated in all District and Regional meets for Cross Country and Track, winning the Texas State Cross Country Championship as a Freshman in 1977 and again in 1979. She led El Paso High to win the Texas State Cross Country Championships in 1978 and 1979. In track, she won the 1980 Texas State 1600-meter Championship with the seventh fastest time in the nation, setting a state record. Races she didn't win at state - she'd place a close second.

Based on her academic and athletic accomplishments, Norman earned scholarships to scores of colleges but chose national powerhouse, UTEP. While there, she vastly improved her running times, expanded her repertoire, and made All – American.

She graduated with a B.S. in Accounting and later an MBA at Pace University in New York City. She's been on the boards of the Greater NYC YMCA and McBurney YMCA for over a decade and now is a member of the Jim Thorpe Athletic Association as an organizer and fundraiser.

Patsy Norman married blues guitarist, Len Brunson. Together, they've launched entrepreneurial ventures in NYC, Pennsylvania, and Texas. She loves El Paso, her big family, and her great friends that she has met along the way since those exceptional days as a track star from El Paso.

Rita Delnove was born in Vaals, in the Netherlands and is the daughter of Bernie Delnoye, a teacher, and Joseph Delnove, an accomplished runner.

Delnoye's journey into the world of track and field was anything but forced as her parents introduced her to a variety of sports, including gymnastics, tennis, and swimming. At the age of sixteen, she accompanied her father to a track meet in a nearby city and she emerged victorious in the 800 meters, igniting her passion for running and from then on, her interest in the sport began to flourish.

At seventeen, she became a Nationally ranked runner and running started to be part of her

After high school, Delnoye went to an International Medical University in Maastricht and her running career success continued. When an

opportunity opened for a scholarship to run track in the United States, she took advantage, even though she planned to be in the States for a year.

However, that one year turned into a lifetime after she met her current husband, Paul Benavides, himself an outstanding Pole Vaulter on the UTEP Track Team. They have four children, Paulo, Elyse, Isabella and Charlotte.

Delnove graduated with Pre-med degree and many athletic accolades at UTEP, becoming a five - time All -American. To this day, she still holds the UTEP Track outdoor school records in the 3000 and 5000 meters.

Rita Benavides Delnoye still enjoys running through the neighborhood every morning at 5:30 a.m. and hopes to continue this routine for many years to come.

Bobby Stives is in the El Paso Bowling Hall of Fame and current president of United States Bowling Congress (USBC) in El Paso.

Throughout the many celebrated years of his bowling career, he is well - respected among his fellow bowlers and those that know him not only because of his abilities, but of his being kind, supportive, and thoughtful towards others.

He is married to Patricia Stives with three boys, Andrew, John and Christopher while being the current Principal at Irvin High School and a past administrator for EPISD over the past 12 years at Austin, Andress, and Coronado.


He has won the El Paso Scratch classic six times and held the Pro Bowlers Association (PBA) all time seven game scoring record from February 2005 until December 2007 (264.71 average). Stives is the only amateur bowler in the nation to qualify to bowl in a PBA Tour Event from the Tour Qualifying Round three times in (2005, 2007 and 2008).


Stives won doubles in the USBC Nationals in 2006 in Corpus Christi, Texas and has placed six times in the top 100 places for USBC Nationals in an annual event that has over 50,000 participants.

Over the past 30+ years, Bobby Stives has proven himself to be one of the best bowlers in El Paso's history with a bowling resume that far exceeds what most bowlers dream about achieving.

No other bowlers in the past 20 vears in El Paso, Texas can claim the amount of honor scores and prestigious tournament championships that Stives has earned and now his decorated bowling career has allowed him to take his rightful place into the El Paso Athletic Hall of Fame.

Michael Williams is a 1972 graduate of Parkland High School and of Texas Tech University with a B.S. in 1976 and M. Ed. in 1977. He and his wife Jamie have two children, Zachary and Elizabeth.

Coach Williams won his first District baseball Championship in Eunice, NM in 1977. In 1978, he helped open Hanks High School coaching there for 28 years. At Hanks, his teams won 4 District and 8 Bi-district Championships in 14 playoff appearances. Coach Williams received Coach of the Year Honors in 1982, 1984 and 1988.

In 1988 he received the National High School Baseball Coaching Bronze Award from Scholastic Coach Magazine and led Hanks baseball to over 425 wins.

He coached four players who later played Major League baseball, six players inducted into the El Paso Baseball Hall of Fame, and three players/students and an assistant coach inducted into the El Paso Athletic Hall of Fame. Over 60 of his former players competed in baseball at the next level and in 1997, Coach Williams was inducted into El Paso Baseball Hall of Fame.

In 2006, Michael Williams moved into administration, becoming Athletic Director of Ysleta ISD, serving for 13 years. In 2016, he was inducted into the Texas High School Gymnastics Coaches Association Hall of Honor and received the THSADA Regional Athletic Administrator of the Year. In 2018 he was recognized with the Circle of Excellence Award at UTEP on National Girls & Women in Sports Dav.

Michael Williams is still active in Athletic Administration as Assistant Athletic Director in Garland ISD.

Kimberly Ann Phillips - Gomez was born in Pampa, Texas in 1961 to Norman and Eleanor Phillips and at age three the family moved to El Paso, Texas as she is the youngest of three children, with a sister Karen and brother Kyle.


She attended Eastwood High School and West Texas State University majoring in Biology and Physical Education. Her desire to teach and love of Track and Field can be attributed to her parents; both wonderful teachers and her father: a highly successful Track and Field Coach and member of the 1990 El Paso Hall Athletic of Fame.

In 1996 Kimberly Ann Phillips married Horacio Gomez and later had two beautiful daughters, Jana, and Jordan. In 1989 Mrs. Phillips - Gomez started her job at Hanks High School coaching Cross Country, Track and Field and teaching Biology in a coaching career now spanning 41 years.

At Hanks, she has won 23 Track and Field District Championships and eight in Cross Country. Over her coaching career she has taken hundreds of athletes to the University Interscholastic League UIL Regional Meet and 24 athletes to the UIL State Track and Field meet while qualifying 28 runners to the UIL State Cross Country Championships, including a boys' team that placed 4th in 2019. Many of her athletes continue to run in college, professionally, and even in the Olympic trials.

Kimberly Ann Phillips-Gomez has been blessed to work with amazing coaches and wonderful talented athletes however her greatest honor remains coaching for many years alongside her mentor and father, Norman Phillips.

Kenneth E. May was the "behind-the-scenes" virtuoso who made things happen in the El Paso soccer referee community, earning the nickname "Grandissimo". His dedication to the soccer community was instrumental in El Paso being known for a superior level of soccer officials as he exemplifies an individual who selflessly strived to improve soccer officiating.

Legend says, in 1982, at his late son's kindergarten soccer game, Ken criticized the referee saying, "I can do a better job than that and I have never kicked a soccer ball." This fueled his determination to provide the youth of the city a higher level of officiating, beginning his involvement in the El Paso soccer scene.

May officiated over 7,000 soccer games in his 39-year career, from recreational youth to professional matches, representing the city at local, state, and national levels.


In 1986, May was elected President of the Soccer Referee Association of El Paso, which lasted 18 years, supporting, and administering annual training for referees with the goal of gaining more challenging games while pursuing premier levels of officiating.

He retired in 2020, known as a leader and a role model with perhaps his three greatest contributions to the soccer community being teaching referees to "do a good game", maintaining a "Three-man crew", and developing high quality officials.

The legacy of Kenneth E. May will be his efforts to "Raise the Bar" in four decades of dedication and love for the world of "Soccer".

In 2009, he was named a Legend of the Sun Bowl, a testament to his dedication to the event and its importance to the city. Beyond his direct support of sports in El Paso, Jerry's involvement in various charitable and civic organizations showcases his broader commitment to improving the community. He and his wife, Stanlee, are co-founders of the Rubin Center for the Visual Arts at UTEP, furthering cultural enrichment in the city.

His exemplary contributions to El Paso sports and his lifelong commitment to the community make him a proud inductee into the El Paso Athletic Hall of Fame.

Pablo Darancou was born in Parral, Chihuahua Mexico in 1929, and he proudly became a naturalized citizen in 1998. He lived most of his youth in Ciudad Juarez, Mexico where at the age of 19 he found his love for cycling that began his extraordinary cycling career that would last for over 55 years till the age of 75.

Darancou moved his young family to El Paso, Texas in 1967 and remained in the community until his passing in 2018. He was married to Francisca in 1957, they had nine children, 24 grandchildren, and 37 great-grandchildren.

His love of cycling was passed on to his four sons and they continued his legacy in the cycling community, becoming champions through their father's encouragement and training. The Brother's went on to compete and win in the United States, Mexico, and countless international races.

Darancou's extraordinary cycling career was one of legend that straddled the communities of El Paso and Ciudad Juarez as his stellar competitive racing career resulted in an extraordinary number of wins, including several tours of Mexico.

Darancou was a two-time winner of the National Senior Games Cycling Competition and undefeated in El Paso Senior Games cycling competitions. In 1965 he was selected "Athlete of the Year" in Ciudad Juarez and in 1987 was inducted into the Juarez Athletic Hall of Fame followed up in 2009 being inducted into the El Paso Senior Games Hall of Fame.
